# Visual Studio Code

In this course, you are going to use Visual Studio Code (VSCode) which is an Integrated Development Environment (IDE) provided by Microsoft for free. VSCode comes with a wealth of plugins and extensions to make your life easier as a developer. By the end of this reading, you will be able to install and set up Visual Studio Code on your devices.

You have two options for using Visual Studio Code to complete your course activities:

Option 1: Use Visual Studio Code in-browser with Coursera Labs

Coursera's platform offers an in-browser version of Visual Studio Code which is preconfigured and requires no local setup. You can access the Visual Studio Code environment through the "Lab" items included in this course. Your work and files will be saved and available within this in-browser lab while you have course access.


## Option 2: Work on your local device

- 2. Once the download is complete, open the file to install it.
- Use the default directory location when prompted where to install. 4. On the Select Additional Tasks view, make sure the Add to Path is selected.



Download the application based on the chipset you have. M1 macs use Apple Silicon and older versions use Intel.


- 4. Drag and drop the .app file to the Applications link in the File Explorer, as displayed below.

If you are not sure just choose the Universal option.


